

The Pardon Crucifix

This Crucifux has many indulgences attached to it. Pope St. Pius X declared these indulgences upon the Pardon Crucifix in 1905 and in 1907 were approved for the pardon of both the living and the holy souls in Purgatory.

The Pardon Crucifix Indulgences

Whoever carries on his person the Pardon Crucifix, may thereby gain an indulgence.

For devoutly kissing the Crucifix, an indulgence is gained.

Whoever says one of the following invocations before this crucifix may gain each time an indulgence: "Our Father who art in heaven, forgive us our trespasses as we forgive those who trespass against us." "I beg the Blessed Virgin Mary to pray to the Lord our God for me."


Whoever, habitually devout to this Crucifix, will fulfill the necessary conditions of Confession and Holy Communion, may gain a Plenary Indulgence on the following feasts: On the feasts of the Five Wounds of our Lord, the Invention of the Holy Cross, the Exaltation of the Holy Cross, the Immaculate Conception, and the Seven Sorrows (Dolors) of the Blessed Virgin Mary.

WHOEVER, at the moment of death, fortified with the Sacraments of the Church, or contrite of heart, in the supposition of being unable to receive them, will kiss this Crucifix and ask pardon of God for his sins, and pardon his neighbor, will gain a Plenary Indulgence.

The Chaplet for the Dead

The Chaplet starts on the Cross, and has 4 introductory prayers, followed by 4 decades starting with 1 red bead and 10 black beads. The 5 red beads represent the 5 wounds of Christ. The 40 black beads are in memory of the 40 hours which Our Lord is thought to have spent in Limbo. There are 49 beads total. An indulgence of 23,300 days is granted and applied to the souls in Purgatory for each recitation of this chaplet.

The Chaplet was established by the Archconfraternity of Our Lady of Suffrage in Nimes, France, and approved by Pope Pius IX in 1873.



FIRST TUESDAY DEVOTION FOR THE HOLY SOULS IN PURGATORY

On the first Tuesday of the month:

- 1. Fast from waking through sundown, eating nothing and drinking only water. Eat only one meal after fasting.
- 2. Attend Mass, and offer it for the Holy Souls in Purgatory.
- 3. Pray the Chaplet for the Dead and recite the Prayers for the Holy Souls in Purgatory.



THE CHAPLET FOR THE DEAD

On the Cross:

Out of the depths have I cried unto Thee, O Lord;

R: Lord, hear my voice.

Let thine ears be attentive

R: *to the voice of my supplication.*

If thou, O Lord, shalt observe our iniquities,

R: O Lord, who shall endure it?

For with thee there is merciful forgiveness;

R: and by reason of Thy law, I have waited for Thee, O Lord.

My soul hath relied on His word:

R: my soul hath hoped in the Lord.

From the morning watch even until night,

R: let Israel hope in the Lord.

Because with the Lord there is mercy,

R: and with Him plentiful redemption.

And he shall redeem Israel

R: from all his iniquities.

On the first Pater (red bead):

Eternal rest grant unto them, O Lord.

R: And let perpetual light shine upon them.

Act of Faith (first black bead):

My God, I believe in Thee,

R: because Thou art Truth itself; I firmly believe the truths revealed to the Church.

Act of Hope (second black bead):

My God, I hope in Thee,

R: because Thou art infinitely good.

Act of Charity (third black bead):

My God, I love Thee with all my heart, and above all things,

R: because Thou art infinitely perfect; and I love my neighbor as myself, for the love of Thee.

On all the Paters (red beads):

Eternal rest grant unto them, O Lord.

R: And let perpetual light shine upon them.

On All the Aves (black beads):

Sweet Heart of Jesus, *R: be my love*. Sweet Heart of Mary, *R: be my salvation*.

At the End:

Eternal rest grant unto them, O Lord. *R: And let perpetual light shine upon them.*

May the souls of all the faithfully departed, through the mercy of God, rest in peace.

R: Amen.

May the love of God and the peace of the Lord Jesus Christ bless us and console us and gently wipe every tear from our eyes.

R: Amen.
